Thomas Gooch Honours Citation – Football

Tom was the Vice-Captain of the 1st XVIII winning team in 2016 and he captained for the majority of the season in the absence of Alex Crump through injury.

Tom has played every possible game at 1st XVIII level from 2014 as a Year 10 through to 2016 as a Year 12. He has represented Perth Football Club in their colts system as a Year 10 in 2014 as well as being an integral member of their 2016 table topping team.

Tom became a dominant force in the Scotch College midfield throughout the 2016 season, educating and leading other members who had far less experience than he. Tom was one of only two Year 12 boys in a group of 11 members who ran through the midfield weekly and, therefore, played a significant role within this group. Tom announced his qualities in some of the big games of the year. With an inspired performance whilst injured against Aquinas and a confident display as a goal kicking midfielder against Trinity, Tom was the catalyst for many of the tight victories.

Tom's second half of the season contributed significantly to Scotch College not dropping a game. His ability to extract the ball in tight, whilst linking up around ground took his game to a standard few players are able to reach.

Tom won the fairest and best for Scotch College in a year in which the team won the Alcock Cup and he is a very worthy recipient of Honours.

Cameron Green Honours Citation – Football

Cameron has previously received Honours for cricket making this his second Honours award in sport.

Cameron has been a member of the 1st XVIII Football team for two seasons and he also represented Western Australia as a State 16 just missing out on All Australian Selection.

Cameron was a dominant and highly rated player in the PSA competition. Cameron quickly became the number one forward in the competition averaging three goals per game culminating in 36 goals for the year.

His ability to draw two or three opponents at times had a profound impact on players around him who were able to find space. This did not deter Cameron and as a leader in the forward half of the ground his innate positioning and ability to read the play still enabled him to be the focus when in attack. Whether it was in the air or on the ground opposition players struggled to contain Cameron.

Cameron's talent was very highly regarded in the PSA and he has also attracted attention from WAFL and AFL clubs alike. He was a dominant player in a very strong team and Cameron thoroughly deserves Honours for Football.
