Angus (Gus) MacLeod Year 12 Shearer

Angus MacLeod Honours Citation - Athletics

While PSA Athletics has boasted some outstanding middle-distance athletes over the years, very few have attempted to compete in the 800m, 1500m and 3000m races at either the Quads or Inter-School Athletics Carnival for the simple fact that it is too physically and mentally challenging. Angus is one of the few athletes to compete near their optimum in all three races. At the Quads Angus competed in the Open 1500m first, placing second in a time of 4:15sec; followed by the 800m, placing second in a time of 2:04sec; and finally placed first in the 3000m in a time of 9:41sec. These outstanding performances confirmed that Angus is indeed a very special athlete.

Angus was chosen to compete in the 1500m and 3000m at the Inter-School Athletics Carnival because the standard of the competition is higher with quicker times in races and it is rare for an athlete to be competitive in all three. The events of the day would show that Angus cannot be under-estimated in terms of his mental strength. Due to the injury of an athlete, on the morning of the Carnival, Angus made the decision to compete in the 800m, knowing well that his performance in all three races would be compromised. It was a selfless decision that reflects the character of Angus. He narrowly placed second in the 1500m A Division race in a time of 4:13sec, a personal best of two seconds. In his second race of the day, the 800m B Division race, he placed first, in a time of 2:01sec, a personal best of two seconds. Despite his obvious fatigue Angus went on to finish second in the Division 1 3000m race in a time of 9:26sec, a personal best of 16 seconds. The final 1000m was run in 3:03sec, an amazing effort from an athlete who was completely fatigued. Angus' performance at the 2016 Inter-School Athletics Carnival was outstanding. He showed courage, strength of mind and pure determination to a level his coaches have not seen in a schoolboy athlete and, in doing so, provided outstanding leadership to a generation of Scotch College athletes.

Alexander Crump Honours Citation - Leadership

Alex has demonstrated outstanding leadership in many areas of the College, not only in his role as Co-Vice Captain of School (Operations). In the field of sport, Alex was the Captain of the 1st XVIII Football team. His season was interrupted twice by injury, however, Alex continued to lead the team, even though he was unable to play. He attended all training sessions and did everything he could to ensure the smooth running of drills. On game day Alex was the team runner. In this role, his contribution was outstanding in that he was able to read any particular phase of a play very objectively and make effective decisions on the run. He was then able to effectively communicate structural changes to his team mates and consequently influence games accordingly. He also worked very closely with the coaches on the sidelines. On game day, Alex virtually became another coach. His positive attitude and determination to contribute to the team despite his own significant set-backs is to be admired. In Athletics, Alex again contributed strongly to the ethos of the team, supporting his fellow athletes and striving to do his best.

On the Tanzania Community and Service Tour, Alex was a crucial member of the team. He was heavily involved with others prior to departing in fund-raising activities. He also assisted in formulating a plan for developing the amphitheatre for when the group arrived at the village. Above and beyond this, Alex was always aware of and concerned about other members of the group, providing a strong link between them and enhancing group cohesion.

Alex has shown outstanding leadership in the Awards Committee, a component of the College where very few students or staff would be aware of his contribution. This is a critical committee within the College and a significant point of interface between staff and students, as decisions are made relating to the awarding of Colours and Honours across all disciplines. Alex's measured and reasoned consideration of each case and his willingness to seek and listen to the opinions of others on the committee, demonstrated a maturity and wisdom beyond his years. His ability to objectively review and sensibly discuss sensitive information was of a standard not seen before by senior Committee members. Although protocol obviously meant Alex was not involved in the decision relating to his own awards, his contribution was significant.
