## **Football Honours – Achievement Timothy Walker (Year 12, Keys)**

Tim was overwhelmingly selected by his peers to be the 2017 First XVIII Captain of Football. They recognised his fearless approach and his unparalleled ability to change the momentum of a game.

Tim responded extremely well to the leadership role and it may even have been the inspiration behind him successfully building on a highly successful season in 2016 when he was a competitive and accomplished midfielder. Tim reached new heights in 2017 which saw him perform at a superior level week in, week out. Of the 12 games he played, Tim polled the most, or equal most, coaches' votes on seven occasions. He polled seven more votes than the runner up and was deserving in being awarded the 2017 Cyril Hoft Medal.

Tim wasn't just a dominant player, he was the dominant Scotch player throughout the season. He ran to the absolute best of his ability every game and, at times, he successfully carried his team mates along for the ride. Tim was outstanding in the clearances where he combined well with his team mate and worked harder than any other player on the ground. He was tagged on numerous occasions but this did little to blunt his ball winning skills. When pushed forward, he was equally dangerous.

Tim also represented the East Perth Football Club Colts during the holiday break. The feedback from the East Perth coach was very positive in relation to Tim's contribution and professional attitude making him an excellent ambassador for the College.

## **Hockey Honours – Achievement**

### **Alistair Murray (Year 12, Brisbane)**

Alistair has been an integral member of Scotch First XI Hockey for over three years, with his leadership and ability vital to Scotch College placing equal third in this year's Ray House Cup Competition. Alistair was the Captain of the First XI side for 2017 and led by example both on and off the field. Alistair concluded a fantastic final year with his second First XI Best and Fairest, following on from his dominant victory last season. His leadership throughout this season has been phenomenal. Alistair set the standard of play in many games through his sheer determination and will to succeed; his perseverance changed the course of several games. Alistair had a significant impact upon the younger players at training through his tremendous work ethic; his ability to mentor and his encouragement of other players had a direct bearing on their development.

Alistair has been a strong contributor to Scotch Hockey since making his debut in Year 9, playing all games to cement himself in a talented side. In Year 10 Alistair was part of the successful Scotch side that retained the Ray House Cup at the end of 2015. He has been the standout player in the entire competition over the past two seasons, with his midfield dominance unmatched by any player in the PSA competition.

Outside of school Alistair has achieved several incredible feats at both a Club and State level. He was selected in the Western Australian Under 12s, 13s, 15s x 2 and Under 18s over the past two seasons. In 2016, Alistair collected the gold medal in the State Under 18s national carnival. Alistair collected the bronze medal in the same tournament this year and was vice-captain of the side. He was selected for the team of the tournament, before being named in the Western Australian Thundersticks side, as the youngest of the squad. Alistair has also excelled at Club level, playing two seasons in the West Side Wolves First Grade side, again as the youngest member of the squad. Just recently, Alistair received a West Australian Institute of Sport scholarship, with only one other player in Western Australia receiving the same honour.

As a player, Alistair has been the most talented and respected player at Scotch College over the past decade. His calmness in midfield and perfect distribution of the ball has seen him guide the Scotch side to top four finishes over the past two seasons. His versatility is remarkable, playing any position the side requires at any stage of the game. Alistair scored a number of crucial goals this season, in both open play and during penalty corners.

Alistair Murray is a once in a generation Hockey player; Scotch has been extremely fortunate to have him representing the College over the past three seasons. Alistair's skill level and attitude has had a tremendous bearing on the success of the 2017 Scotch First XI.
