Mitchell has played in the 1st V Basketball team since 2014 when he was in Year 9 and has been an integral part of the 2015, 2016 and 2017 PSA 1^{sts} Basketball competitions.

In 2017, Mitchell was Captain of the 1st V Basketball team. His leadership and performances both on and off the court were outstanding. He played as the team's point guard and controlled much of the ball in attack and defence. Over the six games he averaged 22 points a game with a game high 35 points against Hale School who went on to share the Blackwood Cup with two other schools. Mitchell also gathered several assists, rebounds and steals in every game. He was instrumental in leading the team defence, which helped create scoring opportunities for the Scotch College team. Mitchell possesses an outstanding all-round basketball ability and this is further evidenced in his performances beyond the College.

Mitchell was the starting guard for the WABL under 18's 1st team for the Perry Lakes Hawks Championship side of 2017, averaging 17 points, seven rebounds and five assists a game for the season. He won the MVP (Most Valuable Player) award for the team and was selected in the WABL All-Star team (The top 10 in the state voted by coaches and opposition coaches and referees). He has recently been offered a contract for 2017 with the Men's State Basketball League team at Perry Lakes.
