In 120 years of Scotch College's history, few athletes have matched the high jumping achievements of Sean Szalek.

With the exception of Year 11, due to injury, Sean has set records in the High Jump at the Inter-House Athletics Carnival and PSA Quads Meets each year from Year 7 to Year 12 and at the PSA Inter-School Carnival each year from the Under 13 to the Open Age event. At the 2018 PSA Inter-School Carnival, Sean set a new record of 2.09m and also won the triple jump event.

Sean has been the State Champion in High Jump and the National High Jump Champion for the last five years. In 2016 he representing Australia and was the Oceania Under 18 High Jump Champion and in 2017 he was the Commonwealth Youth Under 18 High Jump Champion.

Sean has provided outstanding leadership within the College through his efforts in coaching other boys. In 2017, while injured, he dedicated his season to coaching the High Jump team and had a significant impact upon their success.

In Year 10 Lachlan was one of the rare players who not only made it into the First XV rugby team, but carved out a starting spot of which he took ownership. While on tour, he was awarded 'Best Player on Tour' and his rare talent soon earned him the name of 'The Magician'. In his debut First XV season, Lachlan's performance was outstanding and his brilliance often turned matches on their head, scoring seemingly impossible tries.

In Year 11 Lachlan joined the leadership team. Following an outstanding pre-season he broke his collar bone in the first round. Lachlan worked hard at rehab and attended every training session, contributing wherever possible. Devastatingly, after returning to play, he re-broke his collarbone in the first week of full contact training, ending his hope of finishing the season. Nomination for Sailing Honours - Achievement

Adam has been an exemplary role model within the Scotch sailing team for six years and was appointed Captain for the 2017/2018 summer season. His leadership ability has led to the sustained success of the team and provided the members with opportunities they might otherwise not have had, whilst leading with confidence and precision when required. Adam's inclusive personality has led to the creation of a team which has bonded and matured together while he has carried himself with a level of respect, noted by members across the state yachting community.
